# The Man and His Work Ephesians 6:5-9 May 4, 2017

#### I. The Gospel transforms culture and our relationships.

<sup>5</sup> Bondservants, obey your earthly masters with fear and trembling, ...

- A. Paul was opposed to every form of injustice.
- B. The Gospel crumbles unjust relationships and creates mutually positive ones between Christians.
  - cf. Philemon 15-16; II Corinthians 5
- C. Our lives must be shaped by the Gospel.

#### II. The Gospel transforms the mindset of workers.

cf. I Corinthians 7:21-22, 12:22-26; Matthew 20:16-17; 25:40-41

- A. Jesus dignifies us.
- B. Jesus transforms your work place into a sanctuary.
  - 1. We respect our earthly boss.
    - ...with a sincere heart, ...
  - 2. We work with integrity.
    - ...as you would Christ,
  - 3. We work with singular devotion to Christ.
    - <sup>6</sup> not by the way of eye-service, as people-pleasers, but as bondservants of Christ, doing the will of God from the heart,
  - 4. We work with joy.
    - <sup>7</sup> rendering service with a good will as to the Lord and not to man,
- C. Our motivation is our eschatological reward.
  - <sup>8</sup> knowing that whatever good anyone does, this he will receive back from the Lord, whether he is a bondservant or is free.

#### III. The Gospel transforms the how and why of our leadership.

- A. We are servants to those we lead.
  - <sup>9</sup>Masters, do the same to them, ...
- B. We act for the well-being of others.
  - ... and stop your threatening,...
- C. We are all servants of the Lord.
  - ...knowing that he who is both their Master and yours is in heaven, and that there is no partiality with him.

- 1. All ground is level at the foot of the Cross. cf. Romans 6:28; Ephesians 2:4; Galatians 3:28
- 2. We are called to imitate the Lord. cf. Mark 10:42-32; Ephesians 5:18c; Philippians 2:1-5

- 2. What attitudes of the Christian worker listed in vv. 5-7 are the most rare in today's workplace?

- 5. How do we cultivate His model of leadership in our lives?
