Judged: Inside or Outside the Church

Romans 2:17-3:8 October 15, 2015

I. Our religious knowledge does not make us acceptable to God.

A. Exposed by our focus.

¹⁷ But if you call yourself a Jew and rely on the law and boast in God ¹⁸ and know his will and approve what is excellent, because you are instructed from the law; ¹⁹ and if you are sure that you yourself are a guide to the blind, a light to those who are in darkness, ²⁰ an instructor of the foolish, a teacher of children, having in the law the embodiment of knowledge and truth—²¹ you then who teach others, do you not teach yourself? ...

B. Exposed by our behavior.

...While you preach against stealing, do you steal? ²² You who say that one must not commit adultery, do you commit adultery? You who abhor idols, do you rob temples?

C. Exposed by the world.

²³ You who boast in the law dishonor God by breaking the law. ²⁴ For, as it is written, "The name of God is blasphemed among the Gentiles because of you."

II. Our religious rituals do not make us acceptable to God.

²⁵ For circumcision indeed is of value if you obey the law, but if you break the law, your circumcision becomes uncircumcision. ²⁶ So, if a man who is uncircumcised keeps the precepts of the law, will not his uncircumcision be regarded as circumcision? ²⁷ Then he who is physically uncircumcised but keeps the law will condemn you who have the written code and circumcision but break the law. ²⁸ For no one is a Jew who is merely one outwardly, nor is circumcision outward and physical. ²⁹ But a Jew is one inwardly, and circumcision is a matter of the heart, by the Spirit, not by the letter. His praise is not from man but from God.

- A. True religious practice must come from an inward faith.
- B. True religious practice must be of the heart.
- C. True religious practice must be by the Holy Spirit.
- D. True religious practice must be for the praise of God.

III. Are you sure there isn't some advantage to being religious?

- A. What's the point of being in a church?
 - 3 Then what advantage has the Jew? Or what is the value of circumcision? ²Much in every way. To begin with, the Jews were entrusted with the oracles of God.
- B. Are you saying that few people being unfaithful affect God's faithfulness?

 ³ What if some were unfaithful? Does their faithlessness nullify the faithfulness of God? ⁴ By no means! Let God be true though every one were a liar, as it is written, 'That you may be justified in your words, and prevail when you are judged.'
- C. Why does God judge me if my unrighteousness brings Him glory?

D. So why not sin more that God might receive more glory?

*And why not do evil that good may come?—as some people slanderously charge us with saying. Their condemnation is just.

⁵But if our unrighteousness serves to show the righteousness of God, what shall we say? That God is unrighteous to inflict wrath on us? (I speak in a human way.) ⁶By no means! For then how could God judge the world? ⁷But if through my lie God's truth abounds to his glory, why am I still being condemned as a sinner?
