Greater Than Moses Hebrews 3:1-6 October 19, 2017

I. The similarity of Jesus with Moses.

- A. apostle and High Priest cf. John 17:18; 20:21
 3 Therefore, holy brothers, you who share in a heavenly calling, consider Jesus, the apostle and high priest of our confession, ...
- B. faithful in His appointment cf. Numbers 12:7, John 14:44-50 ... ² who was faithful to him who appointed him, just as Moses also was faithful in all God's house.

II. The superiority of Jesus over Moses.

³ For Jesus has been counted worthy of more glory than Moses—as much more glory as the builder of a house has more honor than the house itself. ⁴ (For every house is built by someone, but the builder of all things is God.) ⁵ Now Moses was faithful in all God's house as a servant, to testify to the things that were to be spoken later, ⁶ but Christ is faithful over God's house as a son. cf. II Corinthians 3:7-11

B.	servant vs Son	cf. Isaiah 9:6-7
C.	shadow vs reality	cf. Deuteronomy 18:15-18

III. The house that Jesus is building.

And we are his house, if indeed we hold fast our confidence and our boasting in our hope. cf. Ephesians 2:19-22

A.	It belongs to Christ.	cf. Colossians 1:18
B.	It is faithful to Christ.	cf. II Corinthians 13:5
