## 11:11-12 IV. God's design for headship equalizes men and women IN THE LORD.

Men and women need one another to faithfully reflect God's glory.

"Nevertheless, in the Lord woman is not independent of man nor man of woman; for as a woman was made from man, so man is now born from woman. And all things are from God." cf. Galatians 3:27-29; Romans 16:1-2; Genesis 1:27

## 11:13-16 V. God's design for headship is rebellion in an age of relativism.

:13-14 A. Men lose hair, women cover hair, and God gets the glory.

"Judge for yourselves: it is proper for a wife [woman] to pray to God with her head uncovered? Does not nature itself teach us that if a man wears long hair it is a disgrace for him, but if a woman has long hair it is her glory? For her hair is given to her as a covering."
