# Preparation for Worship

Please prepare your heart for worship and silence your mobile devices.

Today's hymn of praise is "Guide Me, O Thou Great Jehovah" by William Williams of Wales (1717-1781). Though Williams wrote more than 800 hymns during his career, "Guide Me O Thou Great Jehovah" is the most popular and is one of the few translated into English. This hymn is used in worship in congregations around the globe and is sung across denominations. It was sung at Princess Diana's funeral service and is commonly heard among Welsh crowds at rugby matches and other public gatherings.

One of the reasons this hymn has remained so popular and has stood the test of time in so many worshiping communities is its universal subject of struggle. Every believer and unbeliever encounters suffering and struggle in this life, and this hymn affirms the reality that God provides for us and uses all the wrong in the world for His glory.

Throughout this hymn, Williams interweaves imagery from the book of Exodus to evoke a sense of God's guidance through trials and tribulations. The God who provided for the Hebrew people wandering in "barren lands" with the "Bread of Heaven" is still and will forever be a God of provisional and sustaining grace.

The final lines conclude exuberantly as the people of Israel sing victory to their Redeemer and Provider. As those redeemed in Christ, we have every reason to sing, too! Let us then, with joy in our hearts, offer praise to our great Jehovah!
