PREPARATION FOR WORSHIP

*As you enter the Sanctuary, please prepare your heart for worship
and silence your mobile devices.*

The fixed center of Christian worship is Jesus Christ our Lord. Our first hymn speaks of a seemingly weak figure — a Lamb, but this Lamb is seated on heaven’s throne. The hymn writer echoes the Apostle John who identifies Jesus Christ as the Lamb of God slain before the foundation of the world.

Although once slain, this Lamb now lives and reigns in heaven. All of the inhabitants of heaven lavish their praise upon Him. The Lamb’s sacrifice is the subject of their song and ours. For He was slaughtered to deliver us from eternal peril to eternal life (Rev. 5:6-14).

As we worship today, may the Lamb of God open the scroll of God’s Word so that we read and hear it profitably. Secondly, may the Lamb of God draw us and others to faith in Him as we lift Him up in praise. Psalm 40:3 declares that when we do so “many will see and fear and put their trust in the Lord.”

Therefore, it is only fitting for us to make much of the innocent, perfect, crucified, risen, reigning, and returning Lamb of God.
