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HOW TO USE THIS BOOK

The book you now have in your hands has been a labor of love. It began with a realization that no matter how excellent and effective our teaching may be, it cannot compete with the influence of you as parents. God has called you specifically and gifted you uniquely to lead your kids "in the nurture and admonition of the Lord." Plainly said, you are the greatest spiritual influence in the lives of your kids. To some of you that is a very intimidating and overwhelming thought (I know I feel that way).

Therefore, we as the church want to help encourage and equip you in your role as the primary discipler of your children, and that is why this book exists. Our goal is to set you up in the best way that we can to have spiritual conversations as a family. Our hope is that you will have opportunities on Sundays, perhaps at lunch after Sunday school, as well as a couple of times a week with the Family Devotionals provided, to talk about God and His importance in our everyday lives.

To help accomplish this, we have standardized the Sunday school curriculum so that everyone from JK-12th grade will be learning the same things each week (age appropriately, of course). This allows you as parents to know exactly what all of your kids are learning without having to keep track of multiple e-mails or schedules. Below you will find exactly what is included and how best to use it.

OUTLINE

We provide you with the main points that your students will be learning each week. We do this so you can be best prepared to discuss what they learned and answer any questions that might come up. We also have included a lengthy section of context for each lesson. We believe it is important for all of us to see how each story in the Bible does not stand alone, but instead fits into the larger drama that God has unfolded.

FOLLOW-UP QUESTIONS

The point of these questions is to be conversation starters for you as a family. They are not exhaustive as to the content of what your children have learned that Sunday, but should just get things started for your family. Our hope is that your children will come to expect a conversation about what they learned in Sunday school for two main reasons. First, we want them to see spiritual conversations as a normal and important part of life and second, we hope this expectation will make them more attentive to what they are learning.

FAMILY DEVOS

We have provided two days worth of Family Devotionals for you to do as a family at home. We chose this number so as to not overwhelm families or discourage them for not being able to live up to expectations. Our hope is that the two provided will be a springboard for even more times of family worship during the week. The two we have included will help build a foundation for the Bible character that they will study on Sunday. You will also see a page on "How to Do Family Devotions" which is there only as a resource for you and not a concrete model that must be followed. In the end, the most important thing is for families to spend time together focused on God's Word and prayer; how that is accomplished is secondary.

HOW TO DO FAMILY DEVOTIONS

When discussing family devotions, the first thing you must know is that there is not just one correct way to do them. Each family is made up of distinct individuals, each with a different personality. Therefore, trying to create a "one-size-fits-all" approach to family devotions is foolish. Below are some helpful hints and guidelines as you lead your devotions. Some of them will be very helpful, while some you will realize do not work for your family. In the end, the point is for you as a family to take time together, reading God's Word and praying together. However you accomplish this is truly a secondary concern.

PLACE MATTERS

- It will be important to find a consistent place where you always do family devotions. Changing the location can drastically change the dynamics.
- Everyone should be at the same eye level. You don't want some on the floor and some in chairs or on the couch. This will encourage participation by all members because they will feel as if they are a part of the group.
- Minimize the distractions. Honestly, doing family devotions is hard enough! Only you know what might distract your kids so be sure you eliminate as many interruptions as possible.

PRAYER MATTERS

- It is important for your children to see the importance of prayer. Therefore, be sure that you pray to begin and end your time together. Often it works best to choose one family member to open the time in prayer (which also helps settle busy hearts). At the end is an opportunity to let everyone pray.
- Give your children a role in prayer. One of the things that my family does that has been successful is that we have four prayer categories: 1- Zachary's class, 2- Bryson's Class, 3- Our extended family and friends, and 4- Missions. Each time we give someone in the house one of these prayer categories. To minimize the "I want..." of our children, we rotate who assigns who to prayer. That way, everyone gets a chance to decide who prays for what. It has saved a lot of disagreements. For our missions category, we alternate between a Mission Memphis partner and a World Missions partner and it has been such a blessing to watch and hear our kids pick up on and pray for those ministries. We also switch it up some nights and just have a time of confession or adoration or thanksgiving so they don't think of God as just someone from whom you ask things.

THE WORD MATTERS

- God's Word is the only thing He promises will bear fruit. It is so important to not only expose them to God's Word but also to teach them how to think about it. One of the best ways to start doing this is to continually remind them that these stories are REAL Isaiah 55:11.
- Get them to interact with the Bible for themselves. It is a huge temptation to just provide the answers for them (since we know everything) but they will get so much more out of it if they think about it for themselves. The hardest part for me in this is that I lose the control. I have to constantly remind myself that I want them to get something out of God's Word and not get frustrated when they don't get out what I want them to.

• Encourage every little step. It will be very important to encourage every interaction they have with God's Word. They will be more willing to share when they know it is a safe place for them to come with their thoughts. At times, that will mean you are going to go down some rabbit trails, but it will be worth the journey. As a part of that, you need to make sure that they get the truth; this means gently correcting when their theology gets out of whack.

TIME MATTERS

- One of the most important things you are teaching your children is that being together is very important. Just the simple act of carving out time every week that does not involve the TV or a meal out will bear fruit. The intentional act of studying the Word and prayer together will bear fruit even if it is down the line.
- Have fun! I know it sounds silly but if your kids have fun doing family devotions, they will want to keep doing them. For us, that is a short game or a role playing moment at the beginning but for you, it can be whatever. Sometimes I think we are afraid that we will be irreverent when we attempt to have fun, but we must remember that God created fun and laughter, so participating in those activities pleases Him.

D6 DRIVING VALUES

At Second, we believe in three guiding principles, known as the D6 Driving Values. We hope that as you and your family go through these devotions together, you will be further encouraged in your relationship with the Lord, your church community, and in your Kingdom mission.

THE LORD IS MY PRIMARY DEVOTION

- Confronted by the holiness of Christ, I seek Him in daily worship, prayer, and repentance. Isaiah 6:1-8
- Compelled by the love of Christ, I strive to be obedient to Him in my thoughts, words, and deeds.
 Il Corinthians 5:14
- Created new in Christ, my identity is no longer in the things of this world. Il Corinthians 5:17
- Confident of the eternity secured for me in Christ, I have peace in the midst of the troubles of this life. *Phillipians 4:6-7*

THE CHURCH IS MY PRIMARY COMMUNITY

- Knowing that the Gospel liberates me from idols, I cannot imagine not joyfully worshipping God every week with my brothers and sisters in Christ. *Thesselonians 1:9b*
- Knowing that the Church is called to be a holy nation, set apart from the things of the world, I will embrace this calling by seeking to be Christ-like in all aspects of my life. I Peter 2:9-12
- Knowing that I am a steward of my resources and not an owner, I cheerfully release my resources to build His Kingdom and not my own. *Matthew 25:14-30*
- Knowing that the Body of Christ is essential to my sanctification, I actively seek relationship and accountability within the church in order to grow in Christ. *Ephesians 4:11-16*
- Knowing that God has given me spiritual gifts to use in the church, I willingly serve. I Corinthians 12:4-7
- Knowing that Jesus is present where two or more are gathered in His name, I happily pray with and for my brothers and sisters in Christ. *Matthew 18:20*

BUILDING CHRIST'S KINGDOM IS MY PRIMARY MISSION

- Belonging to Christ's Kingdom causes us to live as a distinct people who are called to be about applying Christ's work of redemption as far as the curse is found as we eagerly await His imminent return and the renewal of all things. Romans 8:19-21
- Building Christ's Kingdom in all of life is an act of worship, and the reason I am alive is to multiply worshippers and redeem culture. *Il Corinthians 5:16-21*
- Building Christ's Kingdom begins in multiplying worshippers of Christ in my own household. Joshua 24:15
- Building Christ's Kingdom is the lens through which I filter every decision as I further the work of redemption. *Romans* 12:1-2
- Building Christ's Kingdom prioritizes Christ's work of redemption to the extent of intentionally sacrificing our time, money, and talents in furthering the application of the redemption of Christ.

OVERVIEW OF ACTS

But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth. – Acts 1:8

For most of His life and ministry Jesus talked about the Kingdom of God. He gave them pictures and parables to help them to understand it and continually mentioned how He was bringing this Kingdom in. He not only taught it but represented it with His miracles and His heart for the poor and marginalized. The disciples were excited to be a part of something so great and at times got overly focused on the Kingdom and their place in it, even arguing about who would receive the places of honor. Just when it seemed that Jesus' popularity and thus their ministry was reaching more and more people, something strange happened: Jesus was arrested and killed.

The disciples' immediate responses were disappointment and dismay. They wondered to themselves how they got it all so wrong. Didn't Jesus say He was the Messiah? Didn't He read the scroll from Isaiah and tell them that it was fulfilled in their hearing that day? Didn't He call Himself the Son of Man and the Lamb of God? It was in the midst of this confusion that the Lord gave them hope as Mary came and told them that the Lord had risen. Thus began a whirlwind of action and emotion as Jesus appeared to them to show that He had been raised and reminded them of what He came to do: save sinners and preach the Kingdom.

The disciples were filled with awe and joy but didn't really get their role in all of this. They rejoiced that Jesus was back, as surely a resurrected Jesus would convince anyone who doubted previously. They seem to have forgotten that Jesus had sent them out into ministry and had spoken about the fact that they would go to authorities and be persecuted for His Name. They even went back to their old lives and went fishing, seeming to think that the whole thing was over. Again, Jesus shook them up. He told them that He was leaving and that it was now their job to continue His work. As Jesus went and taught and healed and loved, so now they were to go as His witnesses. Jesus also made them a couple of promises. First, they would not have to do this in their own power. They would receive the promised Helper, the Holy Spirit who would give them all they needed to fulfill their mission. Second, He would return and when He did He would bring the full Kingdom of God with Him.

As Jesus ascended to heaven, the disciples watched and waited, even having to be moved by the angels to go and await the Spirit. Once the Spirit came upon them everything changed. The same disciples who once cowered behind locked doors for fear of the Jews after Jesus' death would now find themselves openly proclaiming Jesus at the temple before the religious leaders. God made them into something that was so much greater than they could be as individuals; a church. God would use the disciples to bring thousands to follow Jesus from Jerusalem to around the world, giving them a place of hope and refuge while also giving them a glorious mission: to make disciples of all nations through the power of the Holy Spirit.

As we study Acts, we will get to see God's powerful hand at work through normal people like us and how they transformed the world to the point that we still see their effects today. We get to see the origin story of our church and every church by watching how God used a group of "unschooled, ordinary men" to change the world.

ACTS 2:1-13

CONTEXT

- Jesus had spent time teaching the disciples after the Resurrection
- Jesus then ascended into heaven before their eyes
- Before He left, He told them to wait in Jerusalem on the power of God, the Holy Spirit

OUTLINE

- I. Feast of Pentecost
 - A. Pentecost meant "fiftieth" because is was the 50th day after Passover
 - B. Commemorated God giving Law to Moses on Mount Sinai
 - C. It was a day of feasting and celebration
- II. Coming of Holy Spirit

PURPOSE

Continuing the ministry of Jesus by the power of the Holy Spirit

WEEKLY FOCUS

God calls us to witness with our words and our lives

ACTS 2:14-47

CONTEXT

- Jesus had ascended into heaven but left the disciples with a promise
- Jesus told them that the Holy Spirit would come and give them power
- With that power they are to be His witnesses everywhere
- The Holy Spirit falls on the believers and they are able to speak in the languages of all the people who are assembled for the Feast

OUTLINE

- I. Peter witnesses to the crowd through his words
 - A. Points them to the prophecy that predicted this moment
 - 1. Joel 2:28-32
 - 2. God will pour out His Spirit on all flesh
 - 3. The people will prophesy

 - B. Multitudes believed in Jesus daily
 - 1. Men and women

 - A. They were filled with jealousy
 - B. They didn't like that crowds flocked to apostles instead of the temple
- III. Arrest #1
 - A. The religious leaders and high priest arrested them
 - B. Angel of the Lord appears to them at night
 - 1. Opened the doors and brought them out
 - 2. Gave them instructions
 - a. Go and stand in the temple
 - b. Speak to the people the words of Life
 - C. The apostles trust God and obey
 - 1. Easy to make excuses because just got arrested

 - 1. Guards found prison locked but no apostles

V. The apostles before the religious leaders

- A. High Priest asks them why they are disobeying
 - 1. We told you not to teach in this name
 - 2. You are accusing us of his killing
 - 3. You are filling Jerusalem with your teaching
- B. The apostles' response
 - 1. We must obey God rather than man
 - a. A very bold thing to say to the religious leaders
 - b. The people believed that the religious leaders spoke for God to them and now Peter says they don't speak for God
 - 2. We are witnesses so must share what we saw
 - a. You killed Jesus
 - b. God exalted Him
 - c. He gave us the Holy Spirit
- C. The religious leaders wanted to kill them
 - 1. God uses one of the religious leaders to save the apostles
 - 2. Gamaliel speaks up
 - a. Sends the apostles out
 - b. Speaks wisdom to the religious leaders
 - Many have claimed to be the Messiah and after awhile it dies down
 - We need to stay away from these men
 - · If it is of man it will fail
 - · If it is of God you won't be able to stop them
- D. The judgment
 - 1. They had the apostles beaten for disobeying their orders
 - 2. Told them not to speak in the name of Jesus anymore
 - 3. Let them go

- E. Response of the apostles
 - 1. They rejoiced as they left
 - a. That they were counted worthy to suffer for Jesus
 - b. Suffered as Jesus did and told them they would
 - 2. They continued to preach about Jesus
 - a. Every day
 - b. In temple and from house to house

 speak about Jesus

OUTLINE

- I. The increase in leadership of the church
 - A. Issues came up because of growth of the church
 - 1. Some were being missed when food and provisions were given out
 - 2. Specifically those Jews who spoke mainly Greek-Hellenists
 - B. The apostles gathered the leaders together to discuss
 - 1. The apostles needed to continue to preach the Word
 - 2. Others would be needed to step up and serve the people
 - a. 7 men who were full of Spirit and wisdom and had a good reputation among the people
 - b. Men were chosen and were prayed for by the apostles
 - C. The church continued to grow
 - 1. Number of disciples multiplied greatly
 - 2. Many of the priests even believed

II. The persecution of the leaders

- A. Stephen was doing great wonders and signs among the people
- B. Members of the synagogue of the Freedmen rose up against him
 - 1. Tried to argue against him
 - 2. They could not withstand Stephen's wisdom
 - a. Because he was speaking with the Holy Spirit
 - 3. They got some men to lie about him

 - d. You always resist the Holy Spirit

 - e. As your fathers have killed God's prophets, so do you

 - 2. Came to him to beg for peace
- C. He put on his robes and spoke to the people
 - 1. They called him god and not a man

- D. Angel of the Lord struck him down
 - 1. For accepting worship that belonged to God alone
 - a. Didn't give God glory
 - 2. For his persecution of God's people

 - b. Saw "he had faith to be made well"
 - c. Believed in what he was saying about Jesus
 - 2. Paul commanded the man to stand up
 - a. The man listened and obeyed
- C. The people respond with false worship
 - 1. Didn't know what to make of the man's healing
 - a. Had never seen anything like that before
 - 2. They recalled an old myth where once people said that Zeus and Hermes had walked among the people
 - a. False gods from Greek mythology
 - b. Vengeful and sinful gods
 - c. Kept people in line but were unknowable and didn't love people—saw them as play things for their entertainment
 - 3. They thought Paul and Barnabas were gods
 - a. Paul Hermes, and Barnabas Zeus
 - b. The people brought sacrifices to them and the priest came to worship them

SUNDAY TEACHING

- c. Would have been easy to accept this worship
 - "it's just their culture"
 - "They will understand it later"
 - "Don't want to offend them"
 - They had met so much opposition lately it was nice to be appreciated
- 4. Paul and Barnabas' response
 - a. Tore their clothes
 - Was a Jewish act of repentance
 - Sorrow over sin
 - b. Tried to explain to the people
 - We are just men like you
 - We want to tell you about the true and Living God
 - We are just His messengers
- D. The people went from worship to wrath
 - 1. The religious leaders from the two cities Paul and Barnabas went showed up
 - a. Were now following them to make trouble
 - b. Wanted to hurt their ministry
 - 2. Persuaded the crowd against Paul and Barnabas
 - a. Went from gods to enemies
 - b. Got the crowd to take Paul
 - 3. The crowd stoned Paul
 - a. Often this was done by putting someone in a pit and rolling large stones on top of them
 - b. Can also be hurling rocks at someone until dead
 - c. Whatever they did, they believed that Paul was dead
- E. The response of the believers
 - 1. Came to where Paul was-brave
 - 2. Came around him
 - a. Protecting him
 - 3. Helped him up
 - a. Were with him and encouraging him

F. Paul's response

- 1. He went back into the city for a night
 - a. Amazing courage
- 2. Then went to another city close by to share
 - a. Many heard and believed
- 3. He then WENT BACK
 - a. To Lystra-where he was stoned
 - b. To Iconium and Antioch–where he was opposed by the religious leaders
 - Showed that he was not afraid
 - Showed that he trusted God's plan and provision for him

To strengthen those who believed

- Encouraged them
- Helped them continue in their faith
 - · Telling them it would be hard
 - · He was living proof
- Helped them appoint leaders
 - · Elders in every church

III. They returned to Antioch

- A. Where they were sent from
- B. Reported all that God had done to encourage the church
- C. Told them that God had truly opened the door for the Gentiles

IV. SO WHAT??!!

 - 1. Given to Abraham-Genesis 17
 - 2. Was to be for all of God's people–Jews
- B. Now that Gentiles (non-Jewish people) were believing some thought they also needed to be Jewish
 - 1. Needed to circumcised
 - 2. Needed to follow the ceremonial laws
 - 3. People came from the church in Jerusalem to speak about this to church in Antioch
 - a. Had heard how Gospel was spreading to Gentiles through them
 - b. Wanted to make them change what they were doing

II. The Jerusalem Council

- A. Barnabas and Paul were sent to Jerusalem to discuss this among the apostles
 - 1. To decide once and for all on the issue moving forward
 - 2. Told those there what they had seen among the Gentiles

B. There was much debate

- 1. Good people who loved Jesus on both sides
- 2. Was Jesus only a fulfillment of Old Testament Laws or something else
- 3. Peter speaks
 - a. He was seen as the main leader of the church
 - b. Reminded them who it was about and who was at work
 - God made the choice about where the Gospel was going
 - Only God can save people so if Gentiles are being saved then God must want them to be
 - God has made them the same as us when He gave them the Holy Spirit
 - c. Told them not to put a yoke on their neck
 - It was how you used a horse to do work, would connect them to whatever they were pulling through a yoke
 - Especially one that was too much for God's people before
 - · The Law was impossible for sinful people to keep
 - · Only Jesus kept it perfectly and He did it for us
 - Adding extra things to do made salvation about their works and not Jesus' work on the cross
 - We can't do anything to make us right before God
 - d. Had Paul and Barnabas speak about their ministry among the Gentiles
 - Signs and wonders God did in and through the Gentiles

C. The response of the Council

- 1. James spoke first
 - a. Recounted what Peter said (Simeon is another name for Simon Peter)
 - b. Pointed them all to Scripture
 - Amos 9:11-12
 - People called by God's Name
 - The Gentiles were that now
 - c. Made a suggestions for the future
 - Not add the ceremonial laws
 - Warn them about sin
- 2. The letter to the churches
 - a. How would they get this news out to all the churches?
 - b. The church writes a letter to be given to the churches, starting with Antioch
 - Even sent some from their church to go with the letter to encourage that church
 - Judas and Silas

- c. The church rejoiced upon hearing the letter
- d. Paul and Barnabas stayed there and encouraged the people through teaching and preaching

III. SO WHAT??!!

- A. We as a church will disagree
 - 1. People will always have different opinions
 - 2. People feel strongly about them
- B. We as a church are called to be unified
 - 1. John 17:21
 - 2. Is our greatest witness to the world
- C. We as a church need to talk to each other
 - 1. Be open and honest about our disagreements
 - 2. Talk to each other instead of about each other
- D. Remember it's about God and not us
 - 1. About His glory and not our preferences
 - 2. Need to give up some things for Him to shine

 - Decided it was best to split up

 - We will never know who was "right" or "wrong"
 - a. Paul takes Silas to Syria
 - b. Barnabas takes Mark to Cyprus
- 3. God used this disagreement
 - There were now two teams instead of one
 - Twice the amount of churches would be strengthened
 - Twice the amount of people would hear the Gospel
 - Mark and Paul reconciled
 - · Paul came to love and appreciate Him (Colossians 4:10, 2 Timothy 4:11, Philemon 23-24)
 - God used them both to reach different people

III. SO WHAT??!!

 - Letter to the Ephesians
 - b. God would write to them in Revelation
 - 7 churches were in Asia
 - c. God made sure that the Gospel was spread to them even if not through Paul

 - a. In the night
 - b. A man from Macedonia
 - c. Calls out to Paul "Come over to Macedonia and help us"
 - 2. Paul and his group immediately got up and attempted to go to Macedonia
 - a. "We" in verse 10 makes it seem that the author of Acts, Luke, has joined the team

III. SO WHAT??!!

 - 1. Often grows most in midst of opposition
 - 2. God is working for the good of the church and the world
- B. We often have to sacrifice to be used by God
 - 1. Need to be all things for all people- 1 Corinthians 9:22
 - 2. Need to look for ways to serve others so they can hear the Gospel
- C. God leads us where we need to go
 - 1. Doesn't always give us a vision like He gave Paul
 - 2. Puts people in our lives for us to share with them
 - a. People in need
 - b. In our neighborhood or class or office
 - 3. We need to be open to share in those places where He leads

- There is great persecution that scatters the church out to where God had called them to go—Judea and Samaria—led by a man named Saul
- Jesus meets Saul and Saul believes in Jesus, is baptized, and begins to do ministry
- The disciples, including Peter, are now taking the Gospel outside of Jerusalem and even to the Gentiles which was a surprise to the leaders
- Now that the Gentiles believe, the church begins to send out missionaries in order to spread the Gospel further–starting with Paul and Barnabas
- The focus of the book of Acts goes from Peter and ministry to Jews to Paul and ministry to Gentiles

OUTLINE

- I. Paul is making his way back to Jerusalem
 - A. Would be very dangerous for him there
 - B. His name and fame have spread and the Jews would look to arrest and kill him
- II. The people of Tyre tell Paul not to go
 - A. Paul and his companions went to Tyre
 - 1. Ship they were on was stopping there to unload its cargo
 - 2. Stayed there for seven days
 - B. The people told Paul to not go to Jerusalem
 - 1. They even accompanied him to the boat and prayed with him
 - 2. Wives, children and all

III. The people of Ceasarea plead with Paul

- A. They stay there for a few days in the house of Philip
- B. Prophet named Agabus comes to speak to Paul
 - 1. Showed Paul what would happen if he went to Jerusalem
 - a. Took off Paul's belt and bound him with it
 - b. Told him they would bind him and hand him over to the Gentile authorities

C. Paul's response

- 1. Why are you weeping and breaking my heart?
- 2. I am ready to not just be imprisoned for Jesus but to die for Him
 - a. In Jerusalem in Jesus' Name
- D. The people finally say "Let the will of the Lord be done"
 - 1. Some even went with him towards Jerusalem

IV. James speaks to Peter

- A. James the brother of Jesus
- B. Brings up a problem
 - Many Jews were accusing Paul of telling other Jews that they no longer needed to obey the Jewish laws
 - a. No longer circumcise
 - b. Not obey the Laws set out for them by Moses
 - 2. Paul had not actually done that but had said that Gentiles didn't need to be circumcised to be saved

C. Comes up with a solution

- 1. The Jewish Christians will know that Paul has returned
- 2. They will watch what he does and see if what they heard was true
- 3. There were four men who were taking the Nazirite vow
 - a. They would not have wine or meat for 30 days
 - b. They would have their hair grow during this time
 - c. After the 30 days they would shave off their hair and burn it on the altar
 - d. It was a show of submission to the Lord for what He has done

- 4. They asked Paul to go through the purification with them and even provide the sacrifices for all
 - a. This would affirm Paul's feelings towards being a Jew
 - b. Would be a huge encouragement to the Jewish believers
- D. Paul did not have to do it but did it for the good of the church
 - a. Was willing to submit to the leaders even when he didn't have to
 - b. Would be costly for him to provide the sacrifices

V. SO WHAT??!!

- A. We need to be able to know truth so as not to be influenced by others
 - 1. Even good people
 - 2. Need to do God's will
- B. We need to be willing to lose everything for the sake of Jesus
- C. We need to be willing to do anything for the sake of people knowing and loving God more

 - a. This is the man who is teaching everyone everywhere against the Law of Moses
 - b. He even brought Greeks into the temple which has defiled it
 - Non-Jews were not allowed in the temple but only in the outermost courtyard
 - 2. They stirred up the people and they arrested Paul
 - a. They sought to kill him
 - b. They were beating him
 - B. The commander of the army heard what was happening and sent troops at once
 - 1. The soldiers saw and stopped the beating
 - 2. They arrested Paul and asked for the charge
 - 3. The soldiers had to carry him to keep him from the crowds
 - 4. Were taking him to barracks to keep him safe

II. Paul speaks to the people

- A. Spoke to them in Hebrew which got their attention
- B. Told of his life before he met Jesus
 - 1. Pharisee who imprisoned those who belonged to the WAY
 - 2. Was on way to arrest more followers of Jesus
- C. Told what happened when Jesus came to him
 - 1. Jesus identified Himself
 - 2. Jesus blinded him
 - 3. Jesus sent Ananias to restore Paul's sight
 - 4. Called by Jesus to be a witness for Him
 - a. I will send you to the Gentiles
 - b. Sent him away as protection

III. The crowd responds

- A. Were willing to listen until he mentioned the Gentiles
- B. Told them guards to take him away
- C. Wanted him to be killed

IV. The response of the commander

- A. Wanted to please the crowd so planned on flogging Paul
- B. Figured then he could find out what was really going on
- C. As they got ready to whip him, Paul tells them he is a Roman citizen
 - 1. Romans were not to be punished in this way
 - 2. They immediately stopped
- D. They were afraid of what would happen for what they had done to a fellow Roman citizen

V. SO WHAT??!!

- A. Paul was very bold in the face of great opposition
- B. Paul shared his story of what Jesus did in his life
 - 1. Even to a crowd that might not want to hear it

- B. Made an oath to neither eat nor drink until he was dead
- C. They took their plan to the chief priests and elders
 - 1. Call for Paul to be brought before you
 - 2. We will lie in wait and kill him on the way
- D. Paul's nephew heard about it and told Paul
 - 1. Paul had his nephew tell the commander what he had heard
 - 2. The commander listened and then told the nephew to tell no one else

II. Paul before Felix

- A. Waited for accusers from Jerusalem to arrive
- B. The Jews' charges
 - 1. First they kissed up to Felix
 - a. You have brought us peace
 - b. You have helped us with your wisdom
 - 2. About Paul
 - a. He is a plague
 - b. Stirs up riots among the Jews
 - c. Ringleader of troublemakers
 - d. Tried to profane the temple
 - Bring it dishonor

C. Paul's response

- 1. I came to Jerusalem only 12 days ago
 - a. Had been in custody for about 7 days
- 2. They can't prove that I stirred up anything
 - a. Not causing riots
 - b. Not even disputing with others
- 3. Shares his faith
 - a. I belong to the Way
 - b. I worship the One True God
 - Revealed by the Law and the Prophets
 - Hoping in a Resurrection from Him
- 4. Explains his actions
 - a. Came to temple to bring alms and worship
 - b. They found me purified at the temple
 - c. Some Jews from Asia came and stirred up the crowd
 - d. They have no charges against me

D. Felix's decision

- 1. To have Claudius Lysias come and testify
- 2. Keep Paul in custody for his safety
 - a. Given freedoms and privileges
 - b. Allow his friends to freely visit him

III. Felix and Paul

- A. Felix would often speak with Paul about his faith
 - 1. Both he and his wife Drusilla
 - 2. She was Jewish
- B. Reasoned about righteousness and self-control and judgment
 - 1. Challenged Felix in his sin
 - 2. Alarmed Felix and would send him away
 - 3. Boldly sharing truth with him
- C. Felix wanted Paul to pay him to release him
 - 1. Kept him for two years
 - 2. In order to do the Jews a favor

IV. SO WHAT??!!

- A. Paul continued to be faithful even in midst of opposition
 - 1. Defended himself and his actions
 - 2. Used the opportunities to share his faith with the Jews and the governor
- B. God was using Paul's imprisonment for His glory
 - 1. Where he wrote many of his letters that we find in the Bible
 - 2. Giving truth to the Roman governor
 - 3. Protecting Paul's life

OUTLINE

I. A new governor

- A. Porcius Festus replaces Felix
 - 1. Felix was removed for not dealing properly in a dispute between Jews and Gentiles in Cesarea
- B. Wanted to do right by the people he governed
 - 1. Went up to Jerusalem to meet with Jewish leaders
 - 2. They laid out their case against Paul again
 - 3. Wanted Festus to send Paul to Jerusalem for trial
 - a. They still planned to ambush and kill him on the way
- C. Festus' response
 - 1. I am keeping him in Caesarea
 - 2. I will hear his defense
 - 3. You can come also and bring charges there

D. The problem

- 1. Release Paul and upset the Jews
- 2. Continue to hold Paul and risk upsetting the Romans for holding a citizen without cause

II. The trial before Festus

- A. He had Paul brought out amongst his accusers
 - 1. They could not prove any of the charges against him
 - 2. Paul said he hadn't done anything wrong
 - a. Not against the Law or the Temple or Caesar
- B. Festus wanted to help the Jews
 - 1. Asked Paul whether he wanted to go to Jerusalem for a trial
 - a. Not knowing that Paul knew about the plot to kill him
 - b. Roman judge had to ask permission of a citizen to move a case to another judge
 - 2. Paul says he is where he should be tried
 - a. I have done nothing wrong against the Jews
 - b. If I am guilty then I accept the punishment

 - Kept the soldiers from carrying out their plan
 - Ordered those who could swim to make it to land first
 - The rest made it to land on pieces of the ship
- 6. All were brought to safety
