

## Dear Friends & Family -

Greetings from St. Louis, Missouri – where we've recently enjoyed 10+ inches of snow, shivered through the "Polar Vortex" and today are enjoying a brief respite of Spring-linke weather! We trust that you are doing well and wanted to bring you a few ministry praises and request prayer for Stacy's surgery.

**Prayer for Surgery Monday (Feb 4)!** – As we mentioned in our last letter, we traveled to St. Louis in mid-December, primarily to confirm Stacy's diagnosis and seek the best treatment for her Thoracic Outlet Syndrome (TOS). After trying a month physical therapy (which proved ineffective) and receiving the results of a CT Venogram, in late January she finally received a definitive diagnosis of Venous & Neurogenic TOS on her left side. This means that her subclavian vein and brachial plexus nerve are squeezed as they pass through a tight opening between the clavicle and first rib (the thoracic outlet) – headed from the neck area toward her left arm. With her arm at her side, the vein is 50% compressed; when raised, it can become completely blocked.

Surgery is the only definitive solution. So, tomorrow (Feb 4), Stacy will undergo surgery, and we are thankful that the Lord has opened the door for Dr. Robert Thompson (who treated Stacy's TOS on the right side in 2005) to treat her condition with a TOS surgery on the left side. The TOS decompression surgery involves the removal of the first rib and two muscles, as well as the repair of the subclavian vein. Stacy expects to be in the hospital 4 or 5 days (so, if you're in St. Louis – visitors are welcome!). We hope to return to Chile after about 6 weeks of recuperation and physical therapy.
